Course Outline:

This course is designed for students with no prior experience studying Japanese.

The goal of this course is to help students acquire Japanese expressions and vocabulary necessary for daily life. In this course, students will practice communicating in real-life situations and on topics they are likely to encounter in everyday life, using limited vocabulary and grammar. Among the four language skills, the course focuses primarily on listening and speaking, while also aiming to help students acquire basic reading and writing skills, including hiragana, katakana, kanji, grammar, and composition.

There will be homework/assignments every day. You are required to submit assignments by the deadline.
